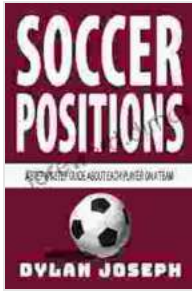
Goalkeeper: The Last Line of Defense

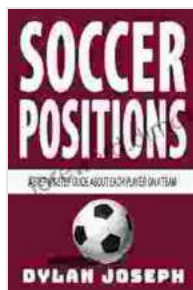
